Robert L. Shewfelt, Professor and Undergraduate Coordinator in the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences at the University of Georgia, has been selected as an **Outstanding Advising Certificate of Merit recipient** in the **Faculty Academic Advising** category as part of the 2004 National Academic Advising Association's National Awards Program.

This award is presented to individuals who have demonstrated qualities associated with outstanding academic advising of students or outstanding academic advising administration. The Faculty Academic Advising category includes those individuals whose primary responsibility is teaching and who spend a portion of their time providing academic advising services to students. Shewfelt is one of 12 faculty advisors honored with this award in this category in nation-wide competition this year.

Each year, since 1983, the National Academic Advising Association (NACADA) in cooperation with ACT, Inc., has honored individuals and institutions making significant contribution to the improvement of academic advising. The goal of NACADA is to promote quality academic advising and professional development of its membership to enhance the educational development of students

The over 7200 NACADA members consist of faculty, professional advisors, administrators, counselors, and others in academic and student affairs concerned with the intellectual, personal, and vocational needs of students. In addition, NACADA represents academic advisors and advising administrators, and serves as an advocate for academic advising.
